Catering Security

Last month's edition was on Cargo Security; on this edition, our focus will be on Catering Security. Security at Catering ensures that catering supplies and catering stores must be adequately secured before they are loaded on - board an aircraft. Catering supplies and stores refers to items such as food, beverages, magazines, newspapers, pillows, blankets and other dry stores. According to ICAO Annex 17, Standard 4.6.5 which is enforced by PNG CASA " Air Niugini has to ensure that all its catering stores and supplies intended for carriage on its commercial passenger flights must be subjected to appropriate security controls and thereafter protected until loaded on the aircraft".

Air Niugini provides inflight catering on all its Domestic and International commercial passenger flights. When Catering personnel load catering supplies and stores into the aircraft, it also provides an avenue for perpetrators to conduct acts of unlawful interference by introducing weapons, explosives or other dangerous substances on board the flight with the intent to cause maximum damage and/or hurt/murder people.

Thus, the Security measures applied to catering supplies or stores are meant to prevent any articles that could be used to carry out an act of unlawful interference against Air Niugini.

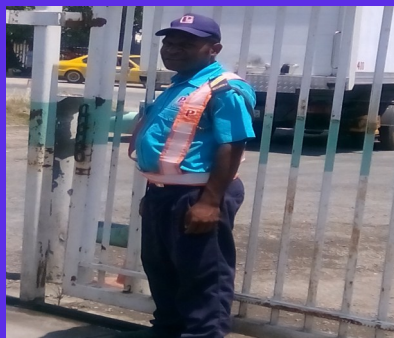
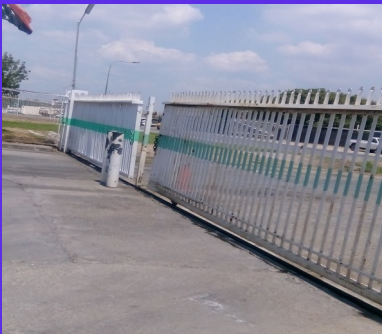

Security Measures at PX Catering.

EVERY EMPLOYEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR SECURITY AT AIR NIUGINI CATERING

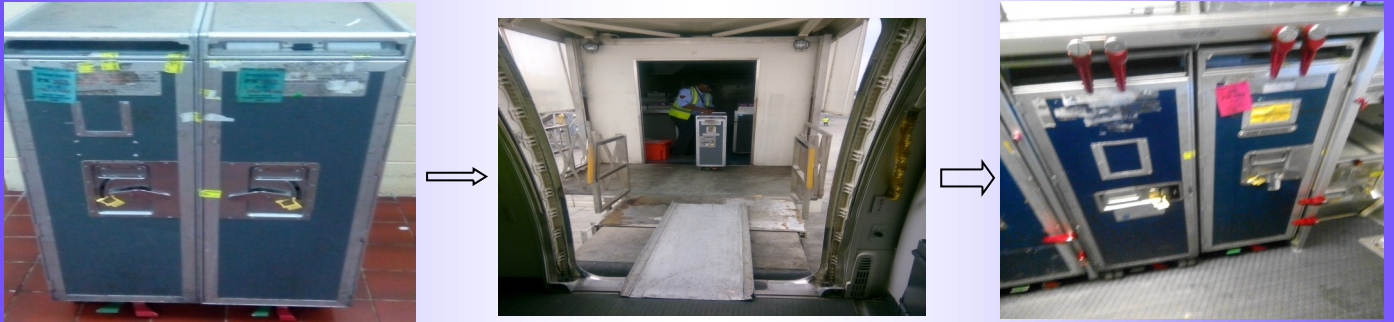


- *Air Niugini uses the following principles/measures to secure its catering supplies & stores:*
 - I. Security measures are applied at the Catering facility/building where catering supplies & stores are prepared, stored & dispatched to ensure no device/weapon is introduced into consignments.
 - ⇒ Current measures includes Perimeter Fencing; 24 hour Guard postings; 24 hour CCTV coverage; Dead Locks & Signage on all entry/exit points and storage areas; and random checks on all employees before and after duties.
 - I. Security measures are applied during the transportation and delivery of catering supplies & stores to the aircraft to ensure the consignments remain secure.
 - ⇒ Current measures includes secured catering carts with PX Security seals, catering seals and locks; catering trucks fitted with lockable doors; and correct documentation.
 - I. Security measures are applied by Cabin Crews on receipt of catering consignments to ensure they have been correctly assigned and not been tampered with.
 - ⇒ Current measures includes confirmation/cross check by cabin crews to ensure all applied seals and locks are not tampered with; and documentation are correct and in order before acceptance on flight.

(Top) Catering & Bar Carts (Below) Yellow Catering Seal with Lock & Enclosed Catering Truck with lockable doors.

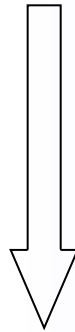
