Welcome to this edition of Balus Toktok Newsletter for August 2021.

Runway upgrades by the National Airports Corporation at some ports

throughout the country continue to challenge our full operations to these areas.

Further to our previous advice regarding the temporary suspension of Air Niugini flights to Madang from 23rd July – 16th August, there was a further delay in the works forcing the temporary suspension of our Dash-8 operations to be extended by six days until Sunday 22nd August.

We look forward to resuming Fokker jet services to Madang once the runway maintenance is complete.

The completion of works is now forecast by NAC to be in November, weather permitting.

Runway works at Wewak, Nadzab and Kavieng also mean these airports are also all limited to DHC-8 operations.

AIR NIUGINI WINS COURT INJUNCTION AGAINST MATRIX

The public may have seen advertisements newspapers by Matrix Constructions calling for a creditors' meeting.

This followed moves by Air Niugini to progress the winding up of Matrix Constructions in the National Court due to their failure to pay Air Niugini outstanding costs.

Air Niugini was successful in legal proceedings in 2020, where the Arbitrator. Richard Chesterman OC made a legal order against Matrix Constructions of costs of K380,000, together with other orders.

Matrix failed to pay these costs and so application was made to the National Court to have Matrix Constructions placed in liquidation.

The dispute about the application for

of liquidation Matrix Constructions will back to the National Court for further hearings in early September.

Based on a belief that the notices were a breach of the Company's Act, Air Niugini filed for and obtained а Court injunction against Matrix Constructions (PNG) Limited, and its delegate Mr Peter Neville.

The effect of the Court Order is that Matrix Constructions and Mr Neville are restrained from conducting any outside the meeting National Court about Air Niugini. This invalidates the advertisements placed Matrix bv Constructions in the public notices section of the Post Courier newspaper last week, inviting creditors of Air

The disputes stem from unfounded claims made concerning t h e construction of the Air Niugini residential apartment building at the Air Niugini head office at International **Jacksons** Airport.

Air Niugini is assessing

its additional legal options relating to these advertisements having damaged Air Niugini's reputation and also how the notice infringes on the existing court action.

The actions various relating to Matrix Constructions will not have any effect on Air Niugini's continuing operations.

UPDATE - AIR NIUGINI FLIGHTS TO MADANG

Further to the previous advice regarding the temporary suspension of Air Niugini flights to Madang from 23rd July -16th August, the runway upgrading works was delayed by six days and work continued Sunday 22nd August.

During that time useable runway at Madang was too short for Link PNG Dash-8 aircraft to operate safely, therefore as a result of the delay in the

works, customers were advised that the temporary suspension of Air Niugini flights to Madang was extended by six days until Sunday 22nd August.

The safety of operations remains our primary concern.

Dash-8 operations resumed from Monday 23rd August. We look forward to the restoration of Fokker jet services to

Air Niugini is also assessing its additional legal options relating to these advertisements having damaged Air Niugini's reputation and also how the notice infringes on the existing court action.
