Welcome to this edition of the Balus Toktok Newsletter for May, 2020.

We are gradually picking up domestic operations following the impact of the COVID 19 pandemic, but our international operations are likely to remain severely subdued for quite some time.

We have recommenced additional flights to domestic destinations namely Daru, Kiunga, Vanimo, Wewak and Buka, although Kieta, Tabubil and Lihir airports remain close and Management has approved to lift the temporary suspension of concessional travel privileges to staff.

We continue to operate with strict health and safety measures in place including temperature testing of all passengers, making available hand sanitiser and providing face masks to all passengers. Internationally, we maintain flights to Cairns, Brisbane and

Singapore. Flights to the rest of our international destinations are still suspended.

We are also in the process of distributing personal hand sanitiser bottles to all our staff for their use.

Congratulations to our inhouse maintenance team who have completed work on a QantasLink (QLink) Q400 aircraft here in Port Moresby.

We also continue to expand the Destinations Loyalty program, recently partnering with Air Niugini Savings & Loans Society bringing the total Destinations corporate partners to 19.

Air Niugini's inhouse maintenance has completed work on an Australian Q400 aircraft here in Port Moresby.

This was the second aircraft in the region to undergo in-house maintenance checks by our Engineering team.

OUTPORT NEWS: AIR NIUGINI RESUMES FLIGHTS TO BUKA

Air Niugini has resumed flights to Buka on Friday 22nd May, 2020.

The interim schedule will consist of one (1) flight operating on a fortnightly basis as approved by the Autonomous Region of Bougainville (ABG) State of Emergency (SoE) Controller.

The first flight PX206 departed Port Moresby on Friday 22nd May at 8am to Buka then continued to Rabaul at 11:35am. PX203 departed Rabaul at 12:40pm for Hoskins then returned to Port Moresby.

Following approval from the AROB State of Emergency (SoE) Controller, Air Niugini will operate an additional service direct to Buka from Port Moresby.

The direct services will be on a fortnightly basis, operated by the

Fokker 70 aircraft.

With the resumption of these flights to Buka, there are some important requirements travelers will have to comply with.

Travelers must obtain clearance

to travel either to or from Buka, by contacting the Controller directly on arobcovid19occ@gmail.com and provide a copy of the written approval at the check in counter before you can be issued a boarding pass.

Passengers arriving in Buka are to comply with a 14day quarantine requirement.

Travelers must always present a valid photo ID and a completed Domestic Travel Application Form (DTAF) at check in.

Forms will be made available at the time of booking or at check in.

AIR NIUGINI OFFERS TRAINING ON INTERNATIONAL MARITIME DANGEROUS GOODS

Air Niugini is now offering training on International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) to external clients in the maritime industry.

The IMDG Code training is now an approved course recognized by the Papua New Guinea National Maritime Safety Authority (NMSA) as the national regulator, under the International Maritime Organization (IMO) requirements.

Air Niugini Non-Technical Training Instructor, Martin Tugano said the training is vital because it assists the shore-based personnel (freight forwarders, shippers, packers), stevedores and deck officers understand and know the types of chemicals/dangerous goods being shipped and

labeled. marked, segregated and loaded ship. onto the Also knowing what to do in an emergency (spill, fire, explosion etc...)

The first training on IMDG was conducted at the Air Niugini Aviation Training (ANAT) centre at 7 mile in Port Moresby in March this year.

Seven officers from four organizations including Express Freight Management, Origin Energy, Hombinmbo Investment Ltd and involved NMSA were in the training.

"Many Tugano said, shipping companies in the world transport dangerous goods by sea

therefore, procedures in loading, segregation and stowage on the ship's deck or under-deck is important. This training was beneficial to our participants in meeting their objective."

The participants received certificates and under licenses NMSA recognized by the International Maritime Organization (IMO).

Two IMDG Code courses are scheduled in June from the 16th to 18th and later in October from the 27th to 29th in Port Moresby.

Tugano added that in-house training can be run if organisations have enough numbers of a minimum five participants.

AIR NIUGINI OPENS FLIGHTS TO ADDITIONAL DOMESTIC DESTINATIONS

Air Niugini is pleased to advise that the SOE Controller has approved the airline to resume flights to Daru, Kiunga, Vanimo, Buka and Wewak.

No approvals at all are required for flights to any domestic locations, although Kieta, Tabubil and Lihir airports remain closed.

Air Niugini is able to offer flights to all available domestic ports, at least once every day, with increased frequency to Lae, Mt Hagen and Tokua.

As noted Controller approval for travel is no

longer required, and tickets can be purchased as normal.

Air Niugini continues to operate with strict health and safety measures in place including temperature testing of all passengers, making available hand sanitiser and providing face masks to all passengers to ensure your air travel is safe.

Internationally Air Niugini maintains its flights to Cairns, Brisbane and Singapore. The outbound flights to these three ports do not require approval.

Inbound flights are now open for sale, however

the inbound passengers still require Controller's approval and evidence of 1 4 day hotel accommodation at an approved quarantine hotel, prior to being able to check in for a flight.

Flights to the rest of our international destinations are still suspended.

We will advise once approval is given for resumption of operations.

AIR NIUGINI CHARTER FLIGHT OUT OF CHINA CARRYING PPEs.

A chartered Air Niugini flight out of Guangdong province of China carrying over 16 tonnes of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) arrived in Port Moresby on May 11th, 2020.

The flight, chartered by the PNG Government, departed Port Moresby on Sunday 10th May, 2020 for Guangdong and returned the following day with the much need supplies. The travel contingent consisted of a crew of five pilots and six staff members who assisted to load the cargo in the cabin of the aircraft in Guangdong.

Minister for Health Jelta Wong, representatives

from the World Health Organisation (WHO) and others, welcomed the aircraft on arrival at the APEC Charter Terminal at 7mile in Port Moresby.
